Please read it carefully and be sure to come to Fiesta with everything your child needs for the performance. Grades 1-2 arrive at 4:30; Grades 3-4 arrive at 4:45 and Grades 5-7 arrive at 5:00pm. **All campers should be seated, in costume at 5:20 in the auditorium.** If you did not receive a copy of the Fiesta flier, please pick one up in the office or view the info on the website.

Fiesta Costume Alert for Girls! Girls' make-up is blue eye shadow, red lipstick and rouge. Please make sure make-up and hair are done prior to drop off at Fiesta. Also, please make sure girls wear shorts under their costumes to facilitate quick changing.

Friday Assembly: Come to the cafeteria on Friday morning for a final Camp assembly, a fun-filled program that will include dances by the Kindergarteners and the Corazon Latino (CL) Dancers. The youth and teen groups of CL will each perform a traditional dance (choreographed by "America's Got Talent" semi-finalists Dario Mejia and Giselle Mejia). The teen group will also perform its modern dance (choreographed by Ayudante, Felicia Tempel). **CL Dancers,** come to the hallway outside the cafeteria by 8:40 a.m. to get into costume.
